New Price Thresholds Announced

In response to Participant feedback, we have implemented revisions to our notification and alert thresholds. These revisions are intended to reduce the confusion associated with multiple price threshold options. The revisions also will provide consistency with the Load Guard Automated Price Response Service price thresholds. Beginning June 2, 2008, the 13-cent per kilowatt hour (kWh) price threshold will be eliminated and replaced by a 14-cent per kWh price threshold for both the Predicted Day-Ahead High Price Notifications and Real-Time Day-Of High Price Alerts.

Predicted Day-Ahead High Price Notifications

Beginning June 2, we will notify you via email when prices are predicted to reach or exceed 14 cents per kWh for any number of hours during the following day. If you prefer to receive these notifications via text (SMS) message or automated phone call, you may still do so by [logging into your WattSpot account](#) or by calling 1-866 WATTSPOT.

You simply have to do nothing. We will automatically transfer you from the 13-cent price threshold to the 14-cent price threshold. When the Day-Ahead Predicted High Price Notification is triggered, we will activate the "Predicted Day-Ahead High Price Notification" banner on the front page of theWattSpot.com website. This banner will remain active from around 3:30 p.m. CDT until the end of the following day.

Real-Time Day-Of High Price Alerts

Beginning June 2, we will notify you during the day via email when real-time day-of prices reach or exceed 14 cents per kWh. You can also select to receive these alerts via text (SMS) message. To do so, please [log in to your WattSpot account](#) or call 1-866 WATTSPOT.

If you have currently chosen the 13-cent price alert, simply do nothing. We will automatically transfer you to the 14-cent price alert.

If you have currently chosen to receive the 10-cent price alert, no action is required. You will continue to receive 10-cent alerts unless you [log in to your WattSpot account](#) and select the 14-cent alert. You can modify these price thresholds at any time.

If you have currently chosen the 14-cent alert, no action is required. You will continue to receive 14-cent alerts unless you [log in to your WattSpot account](#) and select to receive 10-cent alerts.

When the 14-cent Real-Time Day-Of High Price Alert is triggered, we will activate the "High Price Alert" banner on the front page of theWattSpot.com. This banner will remain active until prices are no longer at 14 cents per kWh (or higher) for at least one (1) hour.

This alert price threshold change will not affect the Load Guard Automated Price Response Service, which will continue to offer price thresholds of 10 and 14 cents per kWh.
